5	Council Matters Update, including Planning a. Council offices site JC has tried to make contact with Cllr Ray Bryan to discuss the current situation with DC and PennyFarthing (and other potential bidders), but Cllr Bryan has not responded. JC has now contacted Cllr Janet Dover and is waiting for her response.	
	b. List of planning applications, filtered for our locality GC reports that his source for this list is no longer willing to supply it, citing issues of confidentiality. He is trying to find an alternative source.	GC
	c. Grange Farm Planning application for four dwellings, to be converted from agricultural buildings.	
	d. Neighbourhood plan The timescale for an area to take up the option to submit such a plan is 3+ years. Colehill and Wimborne will cooperate but may well submit separate plans. Furzehill can submit its own plan, ratified by a referendum of residents, either freestanding or as a contribution to Colehill's plan. The Colehill / Holt parish split in the village would pose a problem. The majority view is that the committee should delay further consideration until Colehill's and Holt's intentions become more clear. However, GC will consider whether to undertake some preliminary work, perhaps starting with the proposals in the existing local plan produced by EDDC (now superseded by DC).	GC
